

Reading Awards 2017-18

To positively encourage reading at home, the reading reward system will start again from next Monday. Over the course of this year, there will be the opportunity for your child to earn certificates and stickers of achievement, once they complete a certain number of reads with a relevant comment by a parent or adult that your child has been reading to. As the children move into Years 5 and 6 and become more independent readers, this comment may be written by your own child around what they particularly enjoy, or a word or phrase that they needed to check to meaning of.

Each class teacher will keep a track of parent/child comments, in addition to the support we give for reading at school, and will ensure that once 50 (Bronze), 100 (Silver), 150 (Gold), 200 (Diamond) and 250 (Super Reader) are completed, a reward will be given in our weekly celebration assembly. It would be fantastic to award every child in the school a certificate and sticker. Happy reading everyone!

Lunches

As a school we promote healthy eating and healthy lunches for all our children. For a child to grow and develop properly, it is vital that they are eating a suitable diet. An example of a healthy lunchbox should:

- be based on [starchy carbohydrates](#) (bread, potatoes, rice, pasta)
- include fresh fruit and vegetables/salad
- include a source of protein such as [meat](#), fish, eggs, cheese (or dairy alternative)
- include a side dish such as a low-fat and lower-sugar yoghurt (or dairy alternative), tea cake, fruit bread, plain rice/corn cakes, homemade plain popcorn, sugar-free jelly
- include a still drink such as water, sugar-free or no-added-sugar drinks

It may be that children have the occasional packet of crisps or a chocolate covered biscuit etc, but it should not contain sweets, pure chocolate bars (such as Dairy Milk, Wispa etc), fast food or highly processed/high saturated fat content, as all of these are directly linked to obesity and future health issues, such as diabetes. Lunch boxes are monitored to ensure that the children have enough to eat and are eating the right types of food and with 210 to check, we would

appreciate your support in not including unsuitable items. We have arranged a workshop for parents with a school nutritionist on Tuesday 26th September focusing on healthy snacks and packed lunches. It is from 2.15pm – 3.15pm and will be in the Community Suite. It would be great to see as many of you as possible attending.

Infant Lunches

Don't forget that we need to receive your order by Wednesday for the following week. If not, we will presume that you wish to provide lunch for your child. We cannot process orders after Wednesday as the completed orders have been sent to our supplier. Thank you in advance for your support. If you have any queries about the lunches, please contact the office.

Healthy Snacks

Just a reminder that all infant classes receive fruit or vegetables to encourage healthy eating. Juniors can also bring in a healthy snack for break time.

Milk

Every child under the age of five is entitled to FREE school milk. We encourage you to go online and register your child for school milk at www.coolmilk.com It is very straightforward and the milk is delivered daily to the school, to be distributed at break times. If your child is over 5, whether infant or junior, they are entitled to subsidised milk. The cost is £1.10 per week (22p per day). Orders can be placed at the same address.

Nuts

We have children at St. George's who have severe anaphylactic allergies triggered by peanuts and other nuts. The key to preventing an anaphylactic reaction is to avoid exposure to the trigger. Please do not send foods containing nuts or peanuts to school. This includes Nutella spread and peanut butter.

Annual General Meeting

The Friends of St George's AGM will take place on **Monday 2nd October at 3.30pm** in the community suite.

As parents/carers at St George's School, you are all members and are invited to attend.

We are looking for enthusiastic volunteers who are willing not only to raise money which will benefit all of the pupils at the school but also help organise and run social events throughout the year. If you feel that you would like to play an active part in the school community, you may like to consider putting yourself forward for one of the positions. **Each post is for a year and at the end of that time you can choose to either stand down or put yourself forward for re-election.**

The posts are: **Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer and Secretary positions.**

If you think you may be interested and would like a little more information, please do not hesitate to come and see me. Annette Stapely, our current chair, is also equally happy to give further information about the different posts.

In addition to these, we also need CLASS REPS. This role requires you to be a link between the committee and parents/carers in that class, giving information, asking for support and taking forward any ideas etc. The class reps need to be nominated in the same way as the other FOSG positions.

Any person wishing to put themselves forward for any of these positions must complete the nomination form from the school office. A copy of the form will also be available on the website. You need two people (one to nominate and one to second) who are parents or carers with children attending the school. You then sign the form accepting the proposal. The form must be completed and handed to the office or a standing committee member before the AGM. To make this meeting certified it is important that we have **at least 30 parents/teachers** so please try to spare 30 minutes to attend. Children will be supervised in the ICT suite.

Children being collected from school

If you are not able to pick your child up from school, please write a short note to your child's class teacher outlining the collection arrangements at the end of the school day. If it is a regular arrangement, one letter will suffice for the whole year. It would also be useful, where possible, if you could introduce the adults that are to pick up your child in your absence. If your child is in Year 6 and walking home, we also need a letter confirming this.

Uniform

Thank you for sending your children back to school so smartly dressed on the first day of term. Could you please check that all the children's items are named as we already have a few items which have been found unmarked. As I explained in the Summer newsletter, we are making some changes to the way we sell uniform. Orders must be placed via WisePay and will be sent home with your child. Orders will now only be processed on a Monday and a Friday. If you have mislaid your WisePay login in details, please contact the Office.

Rucksacks

Rucksacks are now available to purchase via WisePay. There are two types available, a smaller version for Infants (£10) and a larger one for the Juniors (£12). There is also an option to have your child's initial and surname embroidered at an additional cost of £2.50. If you wish to order a rucksack, please make your payment via WisePay as we are unable to accept cash and complete the attached form and return to the Office. Please allow 2 weeks for your order.

Parking

Could I remind all parents and carers to be considerate when parking near the school. The local residents understand that school times are busy, but they can become frustrated when they are blocked in or unable to move their car from the driveway and unable to get on with their day. This week we have already had a couple who were blocked in as one of our parents had parked across their garage door. Can I remind parents that it is **ILLEGAL** to park on double yellow lines and very dangerous to park on pavements. The highways agency have encouraged local residents to phone the police and report any illegally parked vehicles, including number plates. We will use the text service to alert any drivers who may not be aware that they are parked in the wrong place. We know that parking can be difficult and to combat this many parents use Asda car park or Shoebury Park and walk down to collect their child.

Volunteers Session

There will be two sessions for any parent/carer who would like to help at the school: in class, on trips, at PTA events etc. You will need to attend one of the sessions to be on the volunteer register, as there have been updates in procedures and policies for keeping children safe.
